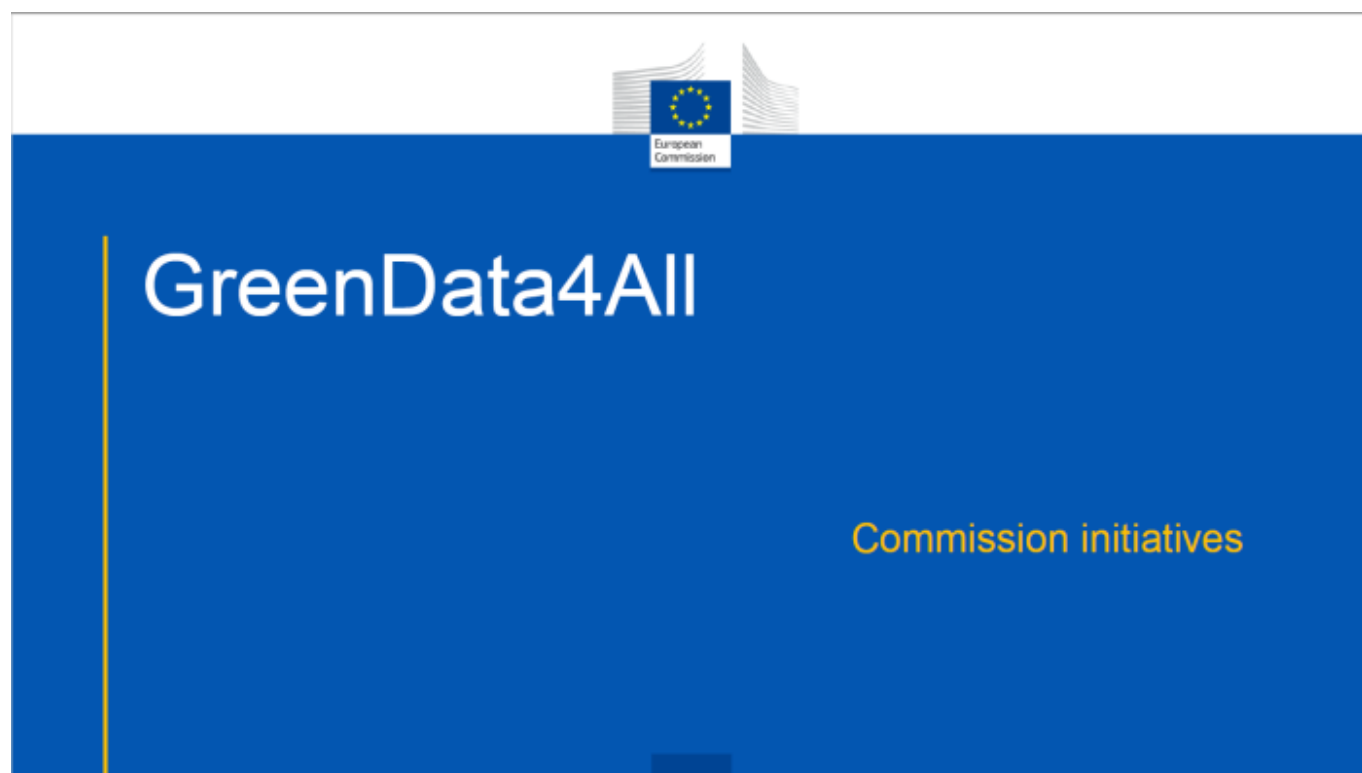


Invitation to SDI stakeholders of the Federation of BH to participate in the Public Consultation as Part of the GreenData4All Initiative

The European Commission invites you to participate in the public consultation as part of the GreenData4All initiative from February 5 to April 30, 2025. This initiative is essential for supporting Europe's green and digital transformation by making environmental data more accessible, available, and reusable. The Commission aims to gather stakeholders' opinions on the issues identified in the evaluation of the INSPIRE Directive, the challenges of the rapidly evolving European data landscape, and possible approaches to addressing these issues.
